Long COVID affects us in many different ways

What is Long COVID?

People with Long COVID can have a wide range of symptoms that last more than 4 weeks or even months after their COVID-19 infection. Sometimes these symptoms can go away or come back again.

People who experience Long COVID symptoms most commonly report:

- Tiredness or fatigue
- Difficulty thinking or concentrating (brain fog)
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Cough
- Fever
- Joint or muscle pain

Other Long COVID symptoms may include:

- Fast-beating or pounding heart (heart palpitations)
- Chest pain
- Dizziness when you stand up (lightheadedness)
- Headache
- Changes to taste/smell
- Inability to exercise
- Depression or anxiety
- Sleep problems
- Diarrhea or other stomach problems
- Rash
- Hair loss
- Changes in menstrual cycles (females only)

What can be done?

People experiencing Long COVID symptoms can speak to a healthcare provider about possible medical treatment to help with their symptoms that could improve their quality of life.
